Our kitchen has cracked, scrambled, baked, and boiled through over 21,500 eggs this year! That's a whole lot of omelets, cookies, and camp breakfasts!

"Cosmic Brownies" Recipe

10 tablespoons butter 1 Cup sugar ½ Cup brown sugar 1 teaspoon vanilla 2 eggs 3/4 cup cocoa ²/₃ cup cake flour ½ tablespoon cornstarch



Frosting

1½ cup chocolate chips ½ cup heavy cream rainbow chips

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Combine butter & sugars. Mix in eggs & vanilla until blended. Add cocoa powder, flour, corn starch, and corn syrup and mix. Spray 8x8 pan and pour batter into pan. Bake for 20-25 minutes and allow to cool. Meanwhile, heat heavy cream and chocolate chips in double boiler. Pour on top of cooled brownies. Sprinkle rainbow chips on top.


