Anchor Bay Quilting Guild-Retreat Group

I have been hosting Quilting / Scrapbooking retreats at the Lions Bear Lake camp for the last 7 years. I have 3 retreats a year. One in December and 2 in April/May. I have to say that out of all retreat centers that I have gone to, this is by far the best. The staff is the best. Let me start with the lodge. The cabins are nice. We only use the bottom bunks, so each cabin can sleep 8 people. Each cabin has two showers, two toilets and four sinks. Chrissy the food director and her team bend over backwards to make sure that each meal is outstanding. If you have a food allergy, she makes sure that you have a meal that you can eat. I have had retreats where there were 3 different food allergies, and she accommodated them all. Traci the executive director is the mama bear. She makes sure that everything runs smoothly. 
