Ronald Coleman


Board Member

One of my favorite parts was sleeping in a cabin with bunk beds. I got to pick my bed and be with my friends. And I LOVED doing the play! I got one of the lead roles, and it was my first time acting. It made me want to do more plays and maybe musicals one day. Watching everyone's plays on the last night in the lodge was really cool, especially with our sleeping bags all spread out on the floor. I'm so excited to go back this year! I want to meet more friends who are just like me and try new things. I loved rock climbing, swimming in the lake, and can't wait to do more theater. INSIDE THE DHH EXPERIENCE: A SPECIAL SESSION FOR CHILDREN WHO ARE DEAF OR HARD OF HEARING

Take a closer look at our Deaf & Hard of Hearing (DHH) Program through the eyes of those who help bring it to life. Hear from Program Coordinator Melissa Behnan as she share swhat makes this week so meaningful for our campers.

My journey with Lions Bear Lake Camp began in the summer of 2008. As a certified teacher of the Deaf and Hard of Hearing (DHH), I was invited to facilitate an activity period during the camp's DHH session. At the time, I had no idea how profoundly this experience would impact my life. That week, I witnessed the power of a space where kids could be surrounded by others just like them. I watched as they bonded over their shared experiences—navigating hearing loss, discussing the pros and cons of their technology, and simply enjoying being understood. It's hard to put into words how incredible that experience was—but I'll say this: I've returned to camp every single summer since. After many years as a facilitator, I stepped into the role of DHH Program Coordinator. Although my responsibilities have changed, the deep personal impact of camp remains the same. I'm honored to work alongside four other certified teachers of the Deaf—Beth, Jessica, Samantha, and Josiah—to create an unforgettable experience for our campers. Each summer, our goal is to provide children with hearing loss the opportunity to connect with others who share similar experiences, all while enjoying a wide range of traditional camp activities. We tailor our session to support campers who communicate through spoken language and use listening devices, ensuring full access to every activity in a way that builds confidence, encourages independence, and fosters lifelong friendships. For me, camp is more than just a place. It's a family. A community. A sense of belonging. It's the belief that everyone deserves a space where they can be themselves, feel understood, and be celebrated. 


