These are the moments and people that make our camp so special-stories that continue to spark joy long after the campfire's last ember.

### **Rachel Lee- Cabin Leader**

Hello, my name is Rachel Lee and I am currently a second year at the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor studying Psychology and Linguistics. I was born with Usher Syndrome, meaning I was born completely deaf in both of my ears and I have a slow degenerative vision loss condition as well. I had no idea camp existed until I was 9 and was very hesitant at first; it would be my first time away from my parents for such a long period of time. However, I decided to give it a try, and in 2015, I attended my first of many Deaf and Hard of Hearing camp sessions. Words cannot even begin to explain how that one week changed me as a person and how this camp has made an impact in my life. I entered that first week of camp as a shy and quiet kid, left as an enthusiastic and energized camper, already looking forward to the next year. Camp has changed me in so many ways, both as a camper and as a staff member over the past nine years. I've met friends who I can always count on and confidently say that I'll always have a bond with these people for the rest of my life. I've grown up with them every summer and I can truly say that I have never been able to connect on such a level with any other group of people I've met in my life. Not only did I gain lifelong friends, I also grew so much as a person and learned so many valuable lessons. I learned how to be fearless and confident in whatever I do, no matter my disability, because i know that I am able to do anything that I put my mind to. That confidence was first grown at camp, starting from my counselors and staff members who encouraged me to do things I didn't want to, like having a main role in our weekly play, or climbing the hard side of the rock wall! Now, as a staff member, getting to watch my campers grow is one of the most amazing things in the world. I can see myself in them, hesitant at first, but growing out of their shell by the last days, laughing with all their friends, and crying because they don't want to leave. My favorite part of every session at camp is being able to watch my campers realize that they'll always have a place and community at camp where they can learn to not be afraid to express themselves, of finding lifelong friends, and gaining an unforgettable experience. Getting to witness that is truly heartwarming and what keeps me coming back to camp, year after year, and back to my second home.









### **Bill Blight - Camp Champion**

For more than three decades, Bill Blight, owner of Blight's Lettering in North Branch, has been the goto person for all of Lions Bear Lake Camp's screenprinted apparel. 




