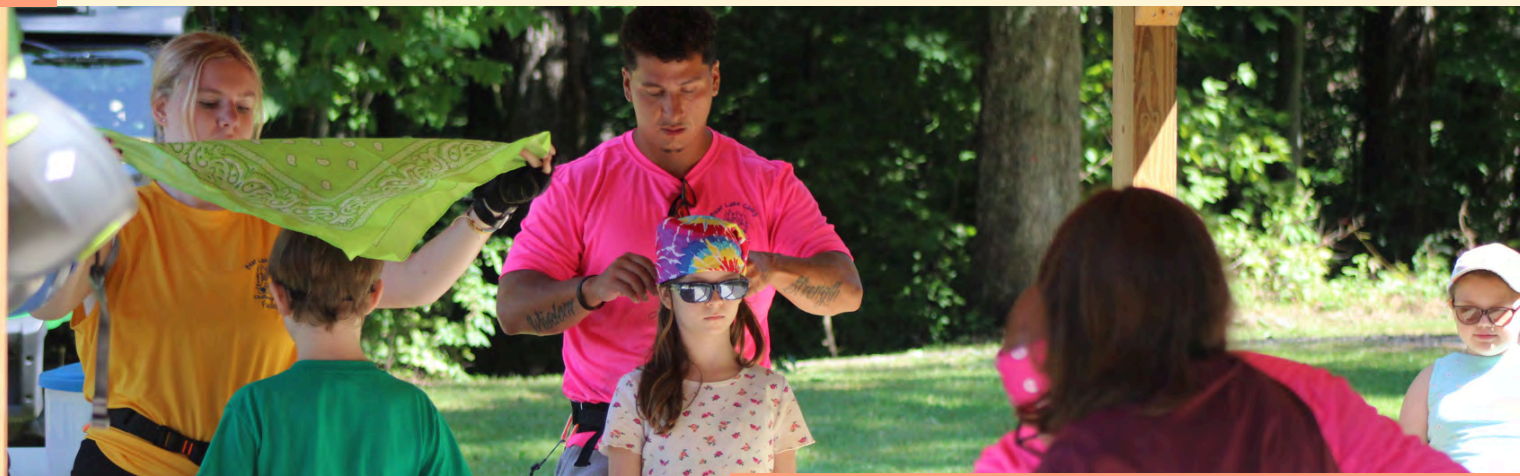

There's something about this place. Maybe it's the fresh air, or the way the morning light hits the trees. Maybe it's the sound of laughter echoing across the lake. But more than that, it's the people. The way we show up for each other. The way we learn each other's quirks, rhythms, and ways of thinking. Not to change them, but to make space for them. Every summer, I get to watch something remarkable happen here. People grow. Sometimes it's loud and easy to spot. A camper conquering the Climbing Tower or finally paddling a kayak on their own. Other times it's quieter. A staff member who starts out unsure, learning how to lead. A shy kid who finds their voice. A kitchen team learning how to move like a family. And sometimes, it's in the eyes of a child who walked in guarded and unsure, but walks out standing a little taller. Kids who might have come in thinking they were different in the wrong ways, only to realize their differences are what make them strong. You see them start to trust their own voice. Start to feel seen. Start to believe they belong. That kind of growth doesn't always come with a cheer or a celebration. Sometimes, it comes in a quiet moment. A shared laugh. A new friendship. A sense of safety they didn't expect to find. Growth doesn't always look the same. It doesn't always happen when we expect it. But it happens. And it's beautiful. We don't always come here knowing who we're going to be. We figure it out by being around people who believe in us. People who remind us of what we're capable of when we forget. That's the real magic of camp. It's not just about activities or schedules. It's about becoming. And it's about how we do that together. This summer, we're anticipating over 1,400 kids walking through these gates. That's 1,400 chances to be part of someone's story. 1,400 moments where kindness, encouragement, and connection might be exactly what someone didn't know they needed. The ripple effect of that kind of impact is impossible to measure. But I know it lasts. We're not here to be perfect. We're here to be present. To lift each other up. To recognize that we all bring something different to the table. And that every one of those differences has a place here. Thank you for being part of this. For bringing your heart, your patience, and your belief in what this place can do.

What stands out most about the camp?

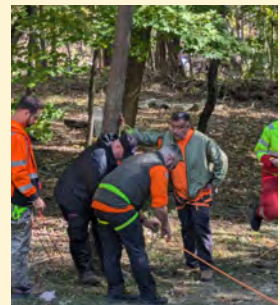
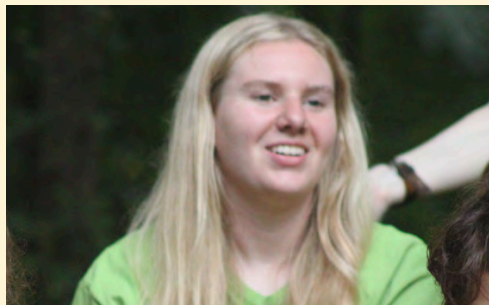
"The professionalism of the staff at Lions Bear Lake models that which we promote amongst our members. The service they provide to the community really reflects what we aim to do as well."

Challenge Course: Preparing for Impact

Welcome! Big thanks to Myron Geinner with Experiential Systems Inc. Even though the April date for our challenge course inspection included wind, snow, sleet, and fridged temperatures, Myron remained committed and continued as scheduled. As we inch closer to the start of the 2025 season, we are preparing for the annual facilitator training and re-certification. Some of the many components include hard and soft skills learned, practiced, and sharpened. These skills allow the facilitator to engage everyone with the tools necessary to challenge individuals to step out of their comfort zone and into new growth. Together as a team we build a positive environment in which camp values are demonstrated and reinforced. Facilitators role model healthy interactions and put lessons into actions and words for intentional teaching campers can understand. Being kind, being respectful and above all being safe are not just the expectations of campers, but of staff as well. It's powerful to think of the impact we can make on children and families' lives. Building self-esteem becomes essential to the transformative power of promoting character development at camp. Providing campers with opportunities to reflect on difficult individual or social experiences allows them to practice different perspectives for better life management outside of camp. An education that can come from discussions or just engaging in the camp environment helps discover the magic for years to come!

INSIDE THE VIB EXPERIENCE

Take a closer look at our Visually Impaired and Blind (VIB) Program through the eyes of those who help bring it to life. Hear from Program Coordinators Harleigh Morris and Gabrielle Allers as they share what makes this week so meaningful for our campers—and for them.

Lions Bear Lake Camp provides a transformative experience that promotes independence and resilience through participation in typical summer camp activities. Each summer, the camp hosts a week-long session specifically tailored toward children with low vision or blindness. During this session, campers engage in a wide range of activities, including archery, boating, fishing, outdoor cooking, and swimming, which serve as avenues for skill-building and personal growth. Throughout the week, there is a strong emphasis on fostering teamwork to overcome challenges and create more inclusive spaces. As part of a peer group, campers navigate a low ropes course, learning to trust and support each other to accomplish collaborative goals. At the end of the session, campers have the opportunity to conquer a rockwall and zip line, proving to themselves that they can achieve anything with determination and encouragement from others. At the end of each day, evening activities are thoughtfully adapted to accommodate those with blindness and low vision and ensure all campers can fully participate in the planned camp fires, dances, games, and more. Throughout the week, accessibility is prioritized, and accommodations are seamlessly incorporated into daily activities and routines. For instance, braille and large print labels are implemented throughout the camp, and at different activities, campers are given the opportunity to explore new areas or unfamiliar pieces of equipment through touch to enhance their understanding and engagement. At LBLC, campers not only have fun but develop crucial life skills, form lasting friendships, and leave with increased confidence and independence. Harleigh is a teaching assistant from Ann Arbor, who first attended the VIB session at LBLC in 2021 and became the program coordinator in 2024. Harleigh previously attended our Juvenile Arthritis camp, beginning in 2011. She is passionate about creating accessible and memorable experiences for campers with any differences in abilities and looks forward to another fun-filled summer. Her favorite camp activities are arts and crafts and our end of the week dance. Gabrielle is a graduate student at Wayne State University from Port Huron. She began attending the VIB session at age 9 and joined the staff in 2019. This summer will be her first assisting Harleigh in the planning and execution of summer programming. Gabrielle is looking forward to taking on this new role and witnessing the growth and increased independence of campers for another summer. Her favorite camp activities are swimming, archery, and fostering lasting memories and relationships with campers and staff.

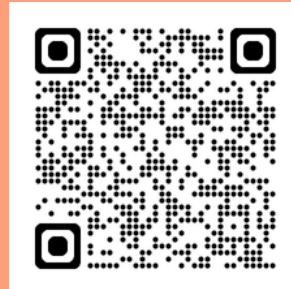

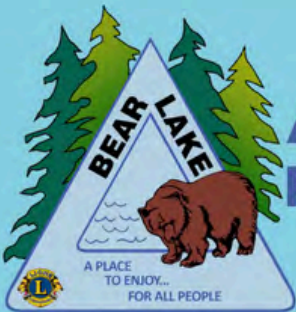
